TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE – THE LIGHT, OSWALD ROAD, SCUNTHORPE**

**1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT**

- 1.1 To request that Members of this Sub-Committee determine the Temporary Event Notice (TEN) for The Light, received 16 July 2014.
- 1.2 A copy of the TEN is attached as Appendix A to this report along with the current Premises Licence as Appendix C.

**2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all Temporary Event Notices where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 Only the Licensing (Activities) Sub-Committee can attach conditions to a TEN if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of a licensing objective, providing such conditions are also imposed in a premises licence applying to the same premises (or part of those premises) and the conditions are consistent with the proposed licensable activities.
- 2.2 When determining the application Members of the Sub-Committee should only consider issues, which relate to the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance objectives.
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and our Statement of Licensing Policy. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policy only if they deem that there is good reason to do so.
- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to pre-determine the Temporary Event Notice or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the Notice and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on Temporary Event Notices in their own ward.

- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee must remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided, which is relevant to the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
- To issue a counter Notice.
  - Not to issue a counter Notice.
  - Impose conditions on the TEN that are already on the Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate.

### **3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 3.1 The Temporary Event Notice was received on 16 July 2014.
- 3.3 A copy of the Temporary Event Notice is attached as Appendix A to this report.
- 3.4 There have been two notices of objection, one from Environmental Health (Commercial) and the other by Humberside Police, both of which have been deemed relevant. The objections and proposals are attached as Appendix B to this report.
- 3.5 Only the Licensing (Activities) Sub-Committee can attach conditions to a TEN if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of a licensing objective, providing such conditions are also imposed in a premises licence applying to the same premises (or part of those premises) and the conditions are consistent with the proposed licensable activities.

### **4. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION**

- 4.1 The Police and Environmental Health (Commercial) are served with a copy of the Temporary Event Notice by the Applicant.
- 4.2 They have until the end of the third working day following the day on which the Police and Environmental Health are given the notice, to notify the Licensing Authority of the reasons why they feel the Prevention of Crime and Disorder or Prevention of Public Nuisance would be undermined.

### **5. OUTCOMES OF MEDIATION**

- 5.1 We have a duty to mediate in accordance with our policy. All parties agreed to the proposals, however the imposing of Conditions can only be made by the Licensing (Activities) Sub-Committee and those conditions can only be attached to a TEN if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of a licensing objective, providing such conditions are also imposed in a premises licence applying to the same premises (or part of those premises) and the conditions are consistent with the

proposed licensable activities. The premises licence is attached as Appendix C to this report.

### **6.1 Prevention of Public Nuisance**

6.1.1 Environmental Health have raised concerns with regard to this objective, which is attached to this report at Appendix B.



**Re: TEN Notification for The Light, 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2014 – Extension of hours**

I write on behalf of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police. We wish to make representations in relation to the above mentioned on the grounds that if granted the Temporary Event extension of hours could undermine the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.

The premise is situated within the Cumulative Impact Zone (CIZ), Nite Safe area and designated public place under Section 12 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001. The locality has a higher than normal crime level, in particular with Alcohol related violence recorded in the immediate vicinity.

Although the CIZ policy is primarily associated with licence applications, the intentions of the policy should be seen as best practice when considering requests for Temporary Events that are for premises within this area and require an extension of hours beyond / over and above what is currently licensed.

Further concern with the extension of hours is the impact on Road Traffic. The Premise exits on to the pavement at a crossroads that from 22:00 hours to 04:00 hours, Friday, Saturday and Bank Holiday is closed with physical barriers. Humberside Police is concerned with the late dispersal of individuals that are highly likely to be under the influence of alcohol into an area that they would normally consider as safe due to road closures.

This particular premise does currently have an application in to permanently extend their hours to a terminal time of 06:00 hrs to which Humberside Police and the Authorities Licensing Manager have objected on the grounds of Crime and Disorder. The hearing has been adjourned to the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2014.

Humberside Police are concerned that this notification may be an attempt to circumnavigate and pre-empt the process.

However, Humberside Police recognise that this is a special occasion to mark the opening of their new premise and not a regular occurrence. We aim to support the businesses in our night time economy and endeavour to create a vibrant but safe night time economy.

NOT PROTECTIVELY MARKED

Therefore, we believe that the attachment of conditions to their Temporary Event, whilst not offering any effective guarantee as to the prevention of crime and disorder, may on this one occasion, go some way to limit the potential detrimental impact on the night time economy.

- There shall be no pool tables, snooker tables or dart boards available for use within the premises on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and all public and bank holidays after 19:00 hours until the closing the following morning.
- A Personal Licence Holder shall be present on the premises at all times that the premises are open for business.
- There shall be at least 2 SIA Door Supervisors on the premise on a Friday and Saturday night and at other times when requested by the police
- At least 1 SIA Door Supervisor shall be present for each 100 person (or part thereof) allowed on the premises
- Door Supervisors working outside the premises shall wear high visibility garments to assist in public safety as they disperse from the premises
- There shall be no off sales from the premises save to the rear yard area
- CCTV cameras shall be maintained to the satisfaction of Humberside Police, the Council and the operator. Cameras shall be linked to monitors located in a suitable position as to be easily supervised by a member of staff
- There shall be a qualified first aider on the premise
- The DPS or responsible person shall ensure that persons entering or leaving the premises are counted by his / her employees or agents using counting machines approved by the council. The total recorded on each counting machine shall, at all times, be available for inspection by officers of the council, fire authority and / or police.
- Instead of counting machines, premises may use a numbered ticket system, including complimentary, guest or free tickets. This must, at any one time for a single performance, indicate the maximum number of people admitted to the premises

Should the applicant be willing to accept the above conditions and modify their notification, we would be willing to withdraw this representation, but would do so strictly without prejudice to the permanent application to the terminal hours.

## **Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

### Supply of Alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence
  - a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of this licence, or
  - b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under this premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### Drinks Promotions

1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) in this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carried a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance or harm to children:
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol); or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in Section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process; or
    - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that person is unable to drink without assistance by reason or a disability).
  3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
  4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol;  
  
(2) the policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
  5. The responsible person shall ensure that:
    - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
      - (i) beer or cider = ½ pint;
      - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky = 25 ml or 35 ml; and
      - (iii) still wine in a glass = 125 ml; and
    - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

#### Alcohol Pricing

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(1);
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P=D+(D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
  - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
    - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### Door Supervision

Door Supervisors shall be licensed with the Security Industry Authority in accordance with the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

### General Conditions

There shall be no pool tables, snooker tables or dart boards available for use within the premises on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and all public and bank holidays after 19:00 hours until the closing the following morning.

### Occupancy

The maximum number of persons in the balcony shall not exceed 60 persons, and the maximum number of persons in the ground floor shall not exceed 790 persons.

A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises at all times that the premises are open for business.

### Door Supervisors

The DPS shall ensure that all door supervisors are licensed with the Security Industries Authority (SIA).

At least 1 SIA door supervisor shall be present for each 100 persons (or part thereof) allowed on the premises.

There shall be at least 2 SIA door supervisors on the premises on a Friday and Saturday night and at other times when requested by the police.

The DPS or responsible person shall ensure that all door supervisors always wear identification badges while working. It is the responsibility of the DPS or responsible person to ensure that door supervisors that are employed through an agency are appropriately licensed.

Door supervisors working outside the premises shall wear high visibility garments to assist in public safety as they disperse from the premises.

### The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

There shall be no off sales from the premises save to the rear yard area.

CCTV cameras shall be maintained to the satisfaction of Humberside Police, the Council and the operator. Cameras shall be linked to monitors located in a suitable position as to be easily supervised by a member of staff.

Tapes shall be retained for a minimum of 28 days. Removal of the tapes and their safe storage shall be the responsibility of the Designated Premises Supervisor.

The premises shall be an active member of the Town Centre Pubwatch Scheme.

The DPS and manager shall attend a Drug Awareness Course.

The Burglar Alarm shall be maintained.

### Public Safety

To avoid broken glass and spillages, which could cause people to slip, can threaten public safety, glass collectors shall be employed whilst the premises are open for business.

There shall be a qualified first aider on the premises.

### Counting Systems

The DPS or responsible person shall ensure that persons entering or leaving the premises are counted by his/her employees or agents using counting machines approved by the council. The total recorded on each counting machine shall, at all times, be available for inspection by officers of the council, the fire authority and/or the police.

Instead of counting machines, premises may use a numbered ticket system including complimentary, guest or free tickets. This must, at any one time for a single performance, indicate the maximum number of people admitted to the premises.

### General Safety

The premises and all fixtures, fittings, equipment (including electrical fittings and equipment), furnishings, decorations and curtains on or about the premises shall be constructed, arranged safely, maintained in a safe and clean condition and in good working order (including where appropriate, good working order).

### Electrical Safety

The premises shall be maintained to an acceptable level, in accordance with current legislation and safety standards. Premises licence holders and the DPS shall ensure that standards are maintained.

Temporary electrical installation shall be installed by a competent persons and be intrinsically safe and shall not remain connected to the permanent electrical supply when not in use.

### Gas Safety

The premises shall be maintained to an acceptable level, in accordance with current legislation and safety standards. Premises licence holders and the DPS shall ensure that standards are maintained.

### Fire Safety

The premises shall be maintained to an acceptable level, in accordance with current legislation and safety standards. Premises licence holders and the DPS shall ensure that standards are maintained.

We recommend that everyone working in the premises (whether for payment or not) shall be instructed on what they shall do if there is a fire on the premises.
