Update on the Joint Strategic Assessment for North Lincolnshire

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

North Lincolnshire Health and Wellbeing Board members are being asked to take note of the updated Joint Strategic Assessment for North Lincolnshire and ensure that this evidence base is used in the development of the Board work plans.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In 2015 a web based Joint Strategic Assessment of need was produced for North Lincolnshire. This was the first time that all the statutory needs assessments carried out by key health and social care partners in North Lincolnshire was brought together in one place. The North Lincolnshire Strategic Assessment is an annual review of the North Lincolnshire area; its people, places and resources. It presents the 'big picture' of the needs and strengths of our population, the progress we have made over the last year, as well as some key local challenges.
- 2.2 It is a statutory function of the Health and Wellbeing Board to produce a Joint Strategic Assessment. The JSA is then used to inform the priorities for the Health and Wellbeing Board and can be used to inform commissioning and policy decisions.
- 2.3 The first JSA in 2015 had a chapter across all of the life stages: Starting Well, Developing Well, Living and Working Well, Ageing Well and Dying Well. There were also thematic chapters covering Population, Vulnerable Children, Local Development Framework, Economy, Housing, Transport, Environment, Safer Neighbourhoods, Sport, Leisure and Culture, and User Voice.
- 2.4 The 2016 JSA is a refresh and update of these chapters. An Additional chapter is included on New Communities. The Local Development Framework Chapter is now called Place Shaping.
- 2.5 The development of the JSA has been led by the Joint Strategic Assessment Group, chaired by the Director of Public Health.
- 2.6 The draft chapters have been signed off through North Lincolnshire Council Management Team and by relevant partner organisations at the JSA group.
