**DRAFT SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT –
PLANNING FOR HEALTH & WELL-BEING**

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 The council is seeking to introduce a Supplementary Planning Document – Planning for Health & Well-Being.
- 1.2 To seek approval to publish this Supplementary Planning Document for public consultation.
- 1.3 That the outcomes of the public consultation are reported to the Cabinet Member, prior to adoption by Full Council.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 Supplementary Planning Documents (SPDs) are prepared under the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012. They form part of the Local Development Framework (LDF) that sets out the Spatial Strategy for a council's area. Whilst SPDs do not have the status of the statutory development plan they do have material weight in the consideration of planning applications. Their purpose is to expand or supplement policies within development plan policies where necessary.
- 2.2 Officers have prepared the Planning for Health & Well-Being SPD in order to provide supporting information and guidance for planners, developers and investors on how the environment and the planning decisions impact on the health and wellbeing of the population. It contains information on how effective planning can have a positive impact on health and health inequalities. It provides guidance towards ensuring that the health implications of any new development are considered. The document will also link strategically to North Lincolnshire's Health and Well-being Strategy, Joint Strategic Needs Assessment and other public health documents.
- 2.3 Under the 2012 Regulations, the council is required publish the draft SPD for public consultation. A public consultation lasting four weeks is required.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The Cabinet Member is asked to approve the draft SPD for public consultation and subsequent adoption.

4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4.1 Adopting the recommendation will allow the council to provide clear policy guidance for applicants and communities on key planning issues. It will set out the key issues for future consideration as part of proposals for dealing with the health implications of new development. It will also provide guidance for officers and elected members in assessing planning applications, as part of the decision making process.

5. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, STAFFING, PROPERTY, IT)

5.1 There are no resource implications.

6. OUTCOME OF INTEGRATED IMPACT ASSESSMENT (IF APPLICABLE)
