**APPLICATION TO RENEW STREET TRADING CONSENT
MELANIE TAYLOR, A18 LAYBY, BROUGHTON CROSSROADS, BROUGHTON,
NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE**

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To request the Committee determines a renewal application for a Street Trading Consent for Mrs Melanie Taylor.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 This Licensing (Miscellaneous) Sub-Committee is authorised to determine applications for the grant, transfer, renewal or revocation of Street Trading Consents.
- 2.2 An application to renew a Street Trading Consent was received by Melanie Taylor on 17 November 2009. A copy of the application is shown as Appendix A to this report along with a site location map.
- 2.3 The site is situated on the A18 Layby, Broughton Crossroads, Broughton, Brigg, North Lincolnshire.
- 2.4 The applicant wishes to trade from a van and trailer, from 8.30 am to 5.30 pm, Tuesday and Wednesday then 8.00 am to 5.30 pm Thursday, Friday and Saturday then 8.30 am to 4.00 pm on Sunday, selling Fruit and Vegetables.
- 2.5 Due to the concerns raised by the Council's Principal Traffic Officer and the Casualty Reduction Officer for Humberside Police regarding the site, the renewal application falls to be determined by the Licensing (Miscellaneous) Sub-Committee.
- 2.6 The legislation also allows the Licensing Authority to attach Conditions to a Street Trading Consent.
- 2.7 Reports will be updated at the meeting if necessary to take account of any additional relevant information received after publication.

- 2.8 Members should not allow themselves to pre-determine or to be prejudiced in favour of or opposed to the application until they have had an opportunity to consider all the pertinent facts.
- 2.9 Members should not allow themselves to pre-determine or to be prejudiced in favour of or opposed to the application until they have had an opportunity to consider all the pertinent facts.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The options available to the Committee under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 when considering such applications are as follows:
 - 3.1.2 Option 1 – To grant the renewal application for a Street Trading Consent as applied for with no additional conditions.
 - 3.2.2 Option 2 – To grant the renewal application for a Street Trading Consent subject to different terms, conditions or restrictions.
 - 3.2.3 Option 3 – To refuse the application for a Street Trading Consent.

4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

- 4.1 Option 1 – To grant the renewal application for a street trading consent may cause road safety issues as raised.
- 4.2 Option 2 – Granting the renewal application subject to alternative conditions may not address the issues raised.
- 4.3 Option 3 – To refuse the renewal application in view of the issues raised from the Council's Highways Section.

7. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION

- 7.1 Humberside Police Casualty Reduction Officer has raised concerns about the site on road safety grounds, this is shown as Appendix B to this report.
- 7.2 The Principal Traffic Officer has also raised concerns about the site on the grounds of road safety. This is shown as Appendix C to this report.

8. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8.1 That the application be determined in accordance with the options outlined at paragraph 3 and the analysis at paragraph 4 above, taking into account information received by Humberside Police Casualty and Reduction Officer Principal Traffic Officer, shown as Appendix B & C to this report.
