**LICENSING (ACTIVITIES) SUB-COMMITTEE**

**LICENSING ACT 2003  
APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE  
CHARLIE'S BAR, BARTON UPON HUMBER**

**1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT**

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application for Variation of a Premises Licence for Charlie's Bar, Fleetgate, Barton upon Humber
- 1.2 There have been two representations, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix 3.

**2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application, the Sub-Committee should only consider issues, which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
  - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - Public Safety
  - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
  - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and our Statement of Licensing Policy. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policy only if they deem that there is good reason to do so.
- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to pre-determine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own ward.

- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided which is relevant to the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Licensing (Activities) Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
- To modify the conditions of the licence;
  - To reject the whole or part of the application
- 2.7 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, statutory consultees and persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision.
- 2.8 The application to vary the licence was presented before the sub-committee on 4 May 2012, however the hearing was adjourned as not all parties were able to attend.

### **3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 3.1 The application for variation of a premises licence for Charlie's Bar was received on 7 March 2012. A copy of the application is attached to the report at Appendix 1.
- 3.2 The premises currently holds a Premises Licence, determined on 19 September 2005. A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached to this report at Appendix 2.
- 3.3 There have been two representations received, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix 3.
- 3.3 The applicant's solicitor has been made aware of the representations.

### **4. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION**

- 4.1 An applicant wishing to vary a Premises Licence has to serve a copy of the application form and a plan of the premises on the statutory consultees the same day as the Licensing Authority receives its copy.
