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Analysis

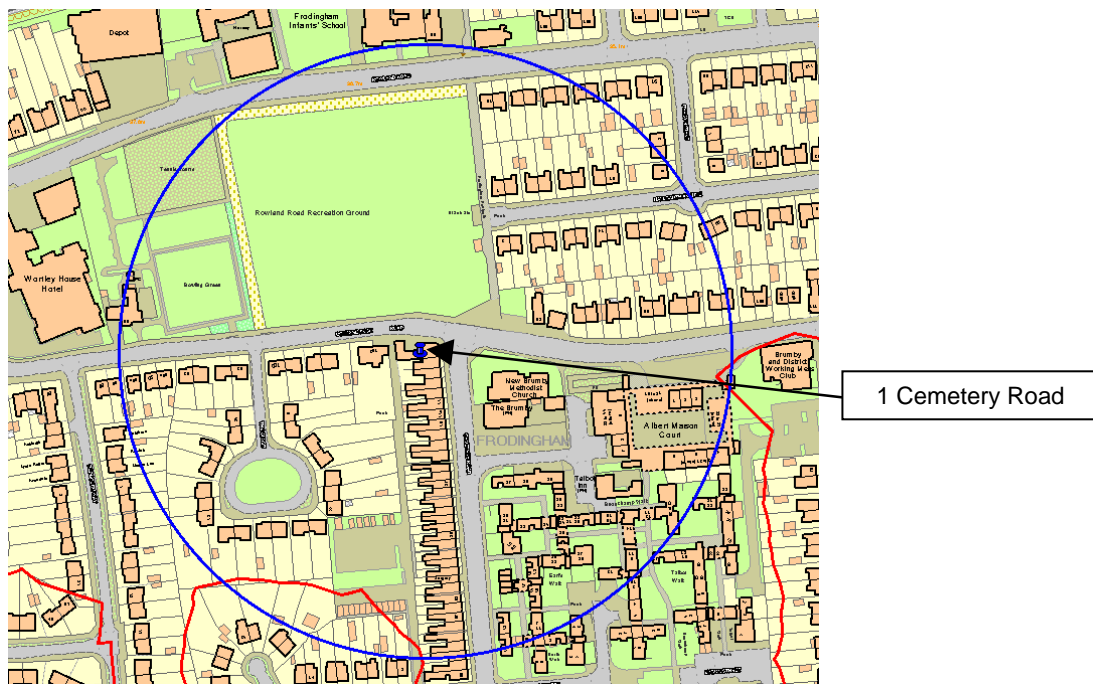
Aim

The aim of this analysis report is to assess the likely impact on crime and disorder of a request for the granting of a premises licence in respect of 1 Cemetery Road, Scunthorpe. Specifically, it aims to answer the following questions asked by the Humberside Police Licensing Officer:

- Levels of Crime broken down into:
 - Types
 - Alcohol related crime
 - Violent crime
 - Shop thefts in the area:
 - Was it alcohol that was stolen
 - Time of occurrence
- Calls for service by year and type
- Levels of anti social behaviour in the area, both Humberside Police and North Lincolnshire Council
- Levels of calls for alcohol related pickups by East Midlands Ambulance Service

Site & Description of Surrounding Area

The property is located within Frodingham ward. The map below shows the location of the licensed premises together with the area used to compile this report.



Vulnerable Localities Index

The Vulnerable Localities Index (VLI) was developed by the Jill Dando Institute of Crime Science at University College London. The purpose of the measure is to support police and crime reduction partnerships to identify localities that require prioritised attention to enhance cohesion in the community. The VLI uses six variables that are split into three broad categories: crime, deprivation and demographic statistics:

- Crime Statistics – recorded crime incidents supplied by Humberside Police
 - Burglary of a dwelling
 - Criminal damage to a dwelling
- Deprivation Statistics – 2010 Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD)
 - Income deprivation
 - Employment deprivation
- Demographic Statistics – 2011 Census
 - Percentage of people without a qualification or only a level 1 qualification
 - Percentage of people aged 15-24 in an area

The six variables are combined to produce an overall index. Any index for an area that is over 100 is above the North Lincolnshire average; if an area has an index of over 200 then it is considered as a vulnerable area that requires focused attention.

The area used for this report is primarily located within Lower Level Super Output Areas (LLSOA) E01013312 with 2 small areas in the south west and east of the area in LLSOA E01013313. The tables below shows the VLI scores for these LLSOAs.

It can be seen that LLSOA E01013312 has scored over 200 and is, therefore, considered as vulnerable. When looking at previous Vulnerable Localities Indices it was found that this area has scored over 200 for each year since 2008.

The area is also within one of the most deprived area in England; in the 2010 IMD it was within the worst 10% of areas in England. Looking back at previous IMDs in 2004 and 2007 the area has scored worse in each subsequent report suggesting that the area is becoming more deprived over time.

Considerations

- The proposed location is within one of the most vulnerable and deprived areas of North Lincolnshire.

Crime Data

The following offences were shown as being committed at the proposed licensed premises. Where a year is not shown no offences were committed at the location.

- 2008-09 – 1 x theft from a shop, 1 x theft by an employee.
- 2009-10 – 4 x theft of a pedal cycle, 1 x theft from a shop.
- 2010-11 – 1 x theft from a motor vehicle.
- 2012-13 – 1 x burglary other than in a dwelling, 1 x assault occasioning actual bodily harm.

Shop Thefts

The next table shows the number of shop thefts per year.

When looking at the location of offences:

- 6 offences were committed at the Premises A, Cottage Beck Road. 4 of these offences were thefts of alcohol varying from 2 cans to 3 crates; 3 offences were committed in 2010 and 1 was committed in 2013.
- 3 offences were committed at 1 Cemetery Road (the proposed licensed premises); 2 when the shop was Candy Corner and 1 when the shop was Ken Timms Ltd. None of the offences were thefts of alcohol.
- 1 offence was committed at Premises B, Rowland Road; it was not a theft of alcohol.

Temporal analysis shows that:

- Over the 6 year period the worst days for offences were Fridays and Sundays.
- All offences were committed between 13:00 hrs and 19:59 hrs.
- When looking at the 4 thefts of alcohol all offences were committed between 17:00 hrs and 19:59 hrs.
- Alcohol thefts were committed on Sunday (2 offences), Friday and Tuesday.

Violence Against the Person

The next table shows the number of violence against the person offences by type and financial year.

Considerations

- Crime in the area is falling; when comparing 2012-13 to 2009-10 (the year with the highest number of crimes being committed):
 - All crime has fallen by just over one-third (38 fewer offences).
 - Alcohol related crime has fallen by 52% (11 fewer crimes).
 - Levels of shop thefts have remained fairly constant with only 1 or 2 offences being reported each year.
 - Violence against the person has fallen by over 62% (27 fewer offences).
 - The number of alcohol related violence against the person offences has fallen by 47% (9 less crimes). That said, the percentage of violence against the person offences that were alcohol related has increased from 44.2% to 62.5%.

Calls to Service (Humberside Police)

The next table shows the number of calls for service by financial year since April 2008 together with the number of calls which were alcohol related (based on having the qualifier QAL within the sub-classification code fields). The following incidents were shown as occurring at the proposed licensed premises. Where a year is not shown no offences were committed at the location.

- 2008-09 – 1 x Suspicious Circumstances - Person/Vehicle/Circs, 1 X Theft - Other (Includes Shop Lifter/Theft), 1 X Theft from Motor Vehicle. Not alcohol related.
- 2009-10 – 2 x Suspicious Circumstances - Person/Vehicle/Circs, 1 X Theft - Other (Includes Shop Lifter/Theft). Not alcohol related.
- 2011-12 – 1 x Domestic Incidents - shown as occurring in the flat above the proposed location however reading through the log it would appear that the incident actually occurred in Winterton. Not alcohol related.
- 2012-13 – 1 x Concern For Safety/ Collapse/Illness/Injury/Trapped - shown as occurring in the flat above the proposed location. Alcohol related.

Considerations

- When 2012-13 is compared to the high level of calls received in 2009-10 the number of calls for service is falling with 108 fewer calls for service in 2012-13 than in 2009-10 a reduction of almost 30%.
- The number of alcohol related calls for service has fallen by over 62% (36 fewer calls).

Anti Social Behaviour Calls for Service (Humberside Police)

The following table shows the number of calls for service for anti social behaviour together with the number of these calls which were alcohol related.

None of the ASB incidents were shown as being committed at the location of the proposed licensed premises.

The table to the right shows ASB incidents for the last 2 years in 4-hour blocks. Data from 2011-12 would suggest that the worst periods for incidents to occur are 20:00 hrs to 23:59 hrs and 12:00 hrs to 15:50 hrs.

Considerations

- The number of calls for service for anti social behaviour incidents has fallen by over 71% with 53 fewer calls for service in 2012-13 than in 2009-10.
- The number of alcohol related anti social behaviour incidents has fallen by over 88% with 23 less calls for service for alcohol related ASB in 2012-13 than in 2009-10.

Calls for Service (East Midlands Ambulance Service)

It has previously been identified that excessive drinking has a huge impact on ambulance services and it is estimated that responding to alcohol-related incidents accounts for nearly 14% of the annual cost of alcohol harm to the NHS in England (DH/NTA, 2006).

East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS) data for the last 2 financial years has been analysed. Due to the lack of fields for direct recording of potential alcohol contribution it is not possible to correctly identify all alcohol-related incidents; the approach adapted is taken from the Yorkshire & Humber Public Health Authority and is shown below:

Whilst there are no specific fields allowing the recording of alcohol-related pickups, the estimation is only based on the illness recorded by the ambulance crews, not the cause of illness. Therefore, the actual figure may be considerably different.

For the purposes of completeness the following criteria have been applied:

- Incident category – “chief complaint” falling within five categories:
 - Overdose/ingestion/poisoning.
 - Psychiatric/suicide attempt.
 - Assault/rate.
 - Falls/back injuries.
 - Unconscious/passing out.
