**LICENSING ACT 2003  
APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE  
THE LIGHT, OSWALD ROAD, SCUNTHORPE, DN15 7PU**

**1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT**

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application for Variation of a Premises Licence for The Light, Doncaster Road, Scunthorpe. The application is shown at Appendix A.
- 1.2 There have been 3 representations, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. and are attached to this report as Appendix C.

**2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application, the Sub-Committee should only consider issues, which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
  - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - Public Safety
  - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
  - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, our Statement of Licensing Policy and our Cumulative Impact Policy. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policies only if they deem that there is good reason to do so.
- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to pre-determine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-

Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own ward.

2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided which is relevant to the licensing objectives.

2.6 The options available to the Licensing (Activities) Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:

- To modify the conditions of the licence;
- To reject the whole or part of the application

2.7 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, statutory consultees and persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision.

### 3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

3.1 The application for the variation of a premises licence for The Light was received on 20 May 2014. A copy of the application is attached to the report at Appendix A. The nature of the variation application is as follows:

This means that member of staff shall be available within 24 hours who is capable of operating the CCTV system and providing recording so long as the Data Controller is happy to release images in accordance with their obligations under the Data Protection Act 1988.</p> <p>A record/log book shall be kept on the premises by the Designated Premises Supervisor of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor. The record shall contain the following details:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. The door supervisors name;</li> <li>b. His/Her Security Industry Authority Licence Number</li> <li>c. The time and date he/she commenced and concluded their duty</li> <li>d. The door supervisors shall sign each entry</li> </ol> <p>When regulated entertainment is taking place between 2300 and 0600 any external windows in areas where live or recorded music is taking place shall be kept closed until when the regulated entertainment is no longer taking place and any door(s) leading from the areas where the regulated entertainment is taking place to outside be closed for the same period save for entry and exit to the premises (NB:this may not in all cases be the last door out of the premises and may be one within a lobby or corridor).</p>
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3.2 The premises currently holds a Premises Licence, determined in November 2009. A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached to this report at Appendix B.

3.3 There have been 3 letters of objection from interested parties, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix C.

3.3 The applicant's agent has been made aware of the representations.



We do not believe that any measures, including additional staffing, security guarding and radio contacts will prevent an increase in crime and disorder, preventing the premises meeting the licensing objectives of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance and Protection of Children from Harm.

The premises are located in within the Cumulative Impact Zone, Nite Safe area and a designated public place under Section 12 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001.

The locality has a higher than normal crime level including alcohol related violence recorded in the immediate vicinity.

The Chief Constable reserves the right to serve further evidence in support of these representations and to expand upon the representations at any hearing in relation to the objection to the application.
