BAMBOOGY, 207 HIGH STREET, SCUNTHORPE, DN15 6LQ**

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application to review the premises licence for Bamboogy.
- 1.2 There have been 2 representations, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. and are attached to this report as Appendix A and C

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for the review of a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application, the Sub-Committee should only consider issues, which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
 - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and our Statement of Licensing Policy. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policy only if they deem that there is good reason to do so.
- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to pre-determine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own ward.

- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided which is relevant to the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Licensing (Activities) Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
- To modify the conditions of the licence
 - To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - To remove the designated premises supervisor
 - To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - To revoke the licence
- 2.7 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant for the review, the holder of the premises licence or any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision.

3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The application for review of a premises licence for Bamboogy was received on 28 March 2013. A copy of the application is attached to the report at Appendix A.
- 3.2 A copy of the application and accompanying documents has been given to the holder of the premises licence and to each responsible authority, by the applicant on the same day as the day on which the application for review was given to the licensing authority.
- 3.3 A notice under Regulation 38(a) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Advertisement of review by licensing authority) Regulations 2005, was prominently displayed for 28 consecutive days dated 28 March 2013. This notice is attached to this report as Appendix B.
- 3.4 A notice under Regulation 38(b) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Advertisement of review by licensing authority) was published on the North Lincolnshire Council Website for 28 consecutive days starting on the day after the day on which the application was given to the licensing division.
- 3.5 There have been 2 representations from responsible authorities, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix A and C.
- 3.6 The premises licence holder has been made aware of the representations.
- 3.7 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached to this report at Appendix D.

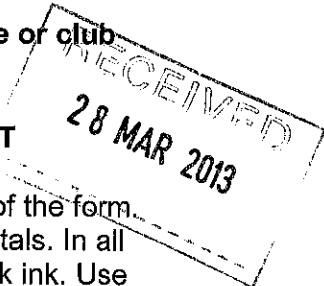

Bamboogy is not adhering to the licensing objectives as there has been a significant increase in serious violent crime directly associated with the venue since 1st November 2012. There have been 17 incidents of which there was 5 Malicious wounding (including 2 instances of glassings), 6 assaults causing actual bodily harm, 5 common assaults and 1 sexual assault.

These have impacted significantly on both the police and health services, taking up a significant amount of valuable resources from both service providers. This is in addition to 17 people unnecessarily becoming the victim of crime.

The incidents referred to all appear to be fuelled by the consumption of excess alcohol, poor management of the venue and inadequate provision of doorstaff.

The level of violence used in some of the incidents has been appalling and sustained.

As a direct result of the unacceptable increase in violent crime, Humberside Police and North Lincolnshire Council Licensing Officers met with the Designated premises supervisor and Premises License Holder on Tuesday 12th February 2013 to outline concerns about the escalating and unacceptable situation. The DPS and PLH appeared very willing to work with the authorities to remedy the situation. He agreed at the conclusion of the meeting to consider the proposals with his Business Partner and submit a minor variation to the local authority, with pragmatic enforceable conditions added to his licence. At the PLH request, a second meeting was held on the 22nd February 2013, where he put forwards his voluntary plans for the premises, including some of the previously recommended conditions. The query was still over the reduction in trading hours, at which point he was to review again with his Partner and respond by the 29th February 2013. There was no further response from the

PLH regarding the proposed minor variation.

On the 12th March 2013, a letter was received from the PLH declaring the hours of trading, with no mention of the previously discussed conditions. A return letter was sent from North Lincolnshire Council reminding him of the two meetings and the proposed changes he was to make, however no response was received.

At 01:30 hours of Sunday 24th March 2013, a malicious wounding occurred which raises clear concerns with Humberside Police about the control of the venue. Whilst the DPS was supportive of the requirement to close the venue, check for forensic evidence and providing CCTV, there is still the question that this is reactive and not preventative management and as such has a detrimental effect on Violent Crime.

Humberside Police have sought to work with the DPS and the PLH of Bamboogy in order to discuss a way forwards to prevent future violence, however we were disappointed in the lack of response following the time and effort put in by both Humberside Police and North Lincolnshire Council to work together.

Therefore, Humberside Police have been left with no option other than to go through the formal review process.

This is both necessary and proportionate as the premises is unable to work within the spirit of the licencing act to achieve and promote the licensing objectives on a preventative manner.

1. The premises will operate polycarbonate glassware at all times, or decant from glass bottles into polycarbonate vessels.
2. The Licensable activities to be reduced from 00:00 - 24:00 hrs to 10:00 to 04:00 hrs and last entry to be at 03:00 hrs.
3. All door staff employed at the premises by or on behalf of the premises licence holder to undertake refresher training on conflict management and communication every 6 months. Records of training must be kept on the premises and provided on request to an officer under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police or an officer of the local authority upon production of identification
4. An incident record book recording any incident of crime or disorder occurring on or at the premises or as a result of any incident at the premises must be maintained on the premises and provided on request to an officer under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police or an officer of the local authority upon production of identification
5. All door staff and the DPS or appointed management staff member to be in continual communication by way of a two-way radio system when the premises are open to the public
6. All staff to undertake quarterly training in relation to actions to prevent person in drink obtaining alcohol. Records of staff training must be kept on the premises and be provided on request to an officer under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police or an officer of the local authority upon production of identification
7. CCTV must be provided in the form of a continuous recording system providing real time pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions. Facial recognition must be provided for pictures of access to and egress from the premises.

Cameras must be positioned to view all access to and egress from the premises [including fire exits] and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs. In addition cameras must be positioned to view the entrances to the public toilets.

Recordings must be correctly time and date marked.

Recordings must be in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a minimum period of 31 days.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure an appointed member of staff is capable of downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format at all times the premises are operating.

Recordings must be provided to officers under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police and employees of the Licensing Authority on request.

The recording equipment and all media used to record data shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.

A monitor with a minimum 15" screen must be placed in such a position so as to be viewed by staff working in the [sales / public area] of the premises and by customers.

CCTV warning signs must be displayed in public areas of the premises

An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked by the DPS or other responsible named individual and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken must be recorded.

CCTV equipment must be maintained in good working order.

Further to the application for a review of the aforementioned premises licence, having discussed proposals aimed at reducing the impact the premises has on the night time economy I am disappointed that a review is now deemed necessary.


Meetings have taken place with the licence holder, the Licensing Authority and Humberside Police to resolve issues that impact on the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives adversely affected are the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety.

The application for review submitted by Humberside Police suggests a number of additional licence conditions. In addition to the said conditions I would advise that the following conditions or activities/persons also be added/removed:

1. There shall be a minimum of four SIA Licensed door supervisors employed at the premises from 21.00 hours until the premises closes. This condition is deemed appropriate to control the premises and reduce crime and disorder.
2. Remove conditions relation to the Dance Floor, Conditions i to iii and viii and ix relation to stewarding. These conditions are no longer needed.
3. Remove the allowance for Off-sales in relation to alcohol so that all sales of alcohol will be for consumption on the premises. This supports the objective of preventing crime and disorder.
4. Consider the removal of the designated supervisor due to the fact that the premises did not report the latest incident and the premises is in need of stronger management.

Please accept this letter as notification of the Licensing Authorities intention to join Humberside Police in the application to review the premises licence of the aforementioned premises.

Supply of Alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of this licence, or
 - b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under this premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervision

Door Supervisors shall be licensed with the Security Industry Authority in accordance with the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

General Conditions

Actively support and participate in 'Nite Safe'.

A personal licence holder shall be on the premises when the premises are open between 20:00 hrs and closing time on a Thursday to Sunday, Christmas and New Years Eve.

Occupancy

The number of persons to be admitted to any one function shall not exceed 300 persons.

Dance Floor

Where the Licence permits the provision of dancing, suitable clearly identifiable and defined areas in positions acceptable to the council must be available for this purpose.

The minimum area to be set aside shall be:-

- i) Sixteen square metres where the licence permits a maximum capacity of between 1 and 99
- ii) Thirty six square metres where the licence permits a maximum capacity of between 100 and 199
- iii) Eighty one square metres where the licence permits a maximum capacity of over 200

In the event that the minimum areas cannot be accommodated a reduced dance area may be acceptable with the consent and approval of the council.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

No open containers or vessels shall be removed from the premises.

Stewarding

At any time whilst the premises are being used for any entertainment the appropriate number of Licensed Door stewards shall be present on or about the premises.

- i) The DPS shall place an employee or agent who is licensed with the Security Industries Authority as an attendant on the outside of each exit door in normal use by patrons entering or leaving the premises while public entertainment is taking place.
- ii) The 'appropriate number' of Licensed Door stewards shall be calculated as follows:
 - (a) One steward for every 100 persons or part thereof at functions attended by mainly adult audiences over the age of 16 years

- (b) Two stewards for every 100 persons or part thereof at functions attended by mainly juvenile audiences under the age of 16 years, or at least one steward per exit whichever is the greater.

The number of persons shall be based on the permitted occupancy figure for the premises.

- iii) All stewards shall be over the age of 18 and be properly licensed in accordance with the Private Security Industries Act. They shall wear appropriate distinctive clothing or armbands so as to be readily identifiable as such to members of the public
- v) The DPS shall maintain a register containing the specified particulars in respect of the each steward acting at the premises

- vi) The DPS shall before entering the specified particulars of any person upon the register to be kept pursuant to this condition satisfy himself by means of acceptable documentary evidence as to the identity of that person.
 - vii) The register to be kept pursuant to this clause shall be kept at the premises and shall be made available at any reasonable time for inspection by authorised officers of the Council, Police or Fire Brigade.
 - viii) For the purposes of this condition "steward" shall mean any person who is for the time being (whether for payment or not) at the premises for the purposes of any duty involving the supervision, control, admission or removal of persons thereto and shall include any person so employed outside the premises.
 - ix) Employers should be aware of their obligations under the Health And Safety at Work Act 1974 to ensure that their employees are provided with adequate health and safety training. Every employer shall also provide their employees with comprehensible and relevant information with regard to the risks associated with their employment, preventative and protective measures, and any health and safety systems and procedures in place at the premises.

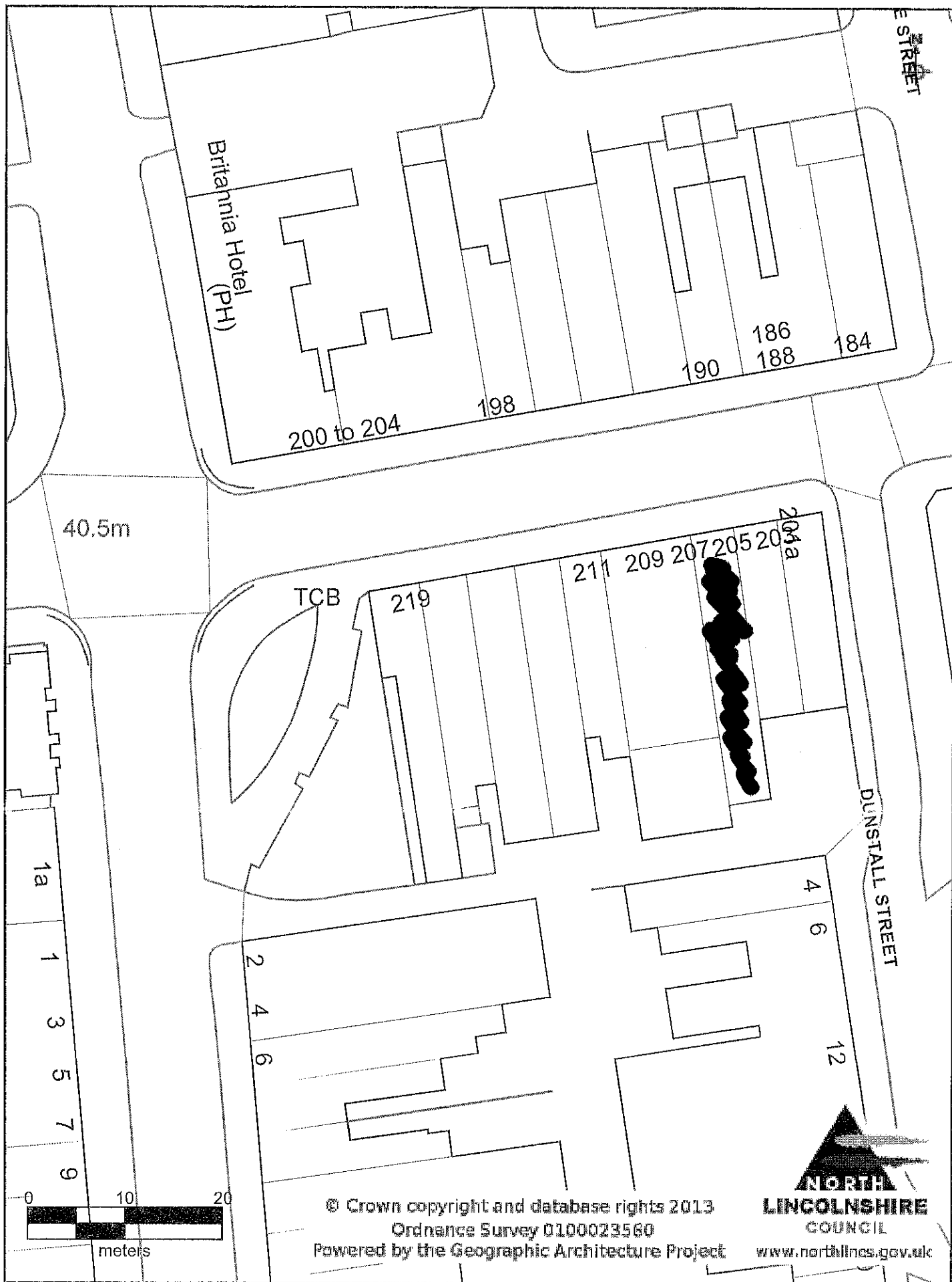
