**RECONSTITUTION OF
WROOT TRAVIS CHARITY PRIMARY SCHOOL
GOVERNING BODY**

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINT IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To consider approving the instrument of government to allow the governing body of Wroot Travis Charity Primary School to be reconstituted.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 At the full governing body meeting of Wroot Travis Charity Primary School, held on 18 June 2014, the governors voted to reconstitute the governing body to bring it in line with the School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012¹.
- 2.2 The above regulations set out the options available to schools in terms of the overall number of governors, the categories of governor and the guiding principles for the constitution. The regulations also require all maintained schools to reconstitute their governing body by 1 September 2015.
- 2.3 The constitution of each governing body is laid down in a document known as the instrument of government. A governing body may at any time request changes to their constitution, in accordance with the regulations, by varying their instrument of government.
- 2.4 Where changes are proposed, a maintained school's governing body must prepared a draft instrument of government and submit it to the local authority for approval.
- 2.5 If the local authority is not content with the draft instrument of government it must advise the governing body and give reasons. If it is not possible for the local authority and governing body to agree on a revised draft the local

authority will produce a final draft for the school as they think fit, having regard to the category of school to which the school belongs.

- 2.6 A comparison of the previous instrument of government and the proposed instrument of government is summarised below:

Table 1: Proposed changes in constitution

- 2.7 The 2012 regulations give the governing bodies more flexibility with their constitution and state that governing bodies should be no bigger than they need to be to carry out their statutory duties.

- 2.8 Appendix 1 of this report sets out the constitution of the governing body in the form of an instrument of government, as requested by the governors of Wroot Travis Charity Primary School.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 **Option 1:** To approve the new instrument of government for Wroot Travis Charity Primary School.
- 3.2 **Option 2:** Not to approve the new instrument of government for Wroot Travis Charity Primary School.

4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4.1 Option 1:

- 4.1.1 The proposed instrument of government, shown in appendix 1, meets the requirements of relevant legislation.

4.1.2 Approving the instrument of government will allow for the revised structure of the governing body for the primary school to be put in place on 1 September 2014.

4.1.3 The governing body will remain the same at 12 governors: therefore no governors will be displaced.

4.1.4 The LEA (local education authority) governor will be moved across to the local authority position.

4.2 Option 2

4.2.1 If the instrument of government was not approved for the primary school, then an alternative structure would have to be put in place prior to 1 September 2015.

5.1 None

6. OUTCOMES OF INTEGRATED IMPACT ASSESSMENT

6.1 An integrated impact assessment has not been undertaken in respect of this decision. The change of instrument is required by statutory legislation.

6.2 The School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012 sets out the framework for the constitution of governing bodies and the process of making instruments of government. The instrument of government proposed in appendix 1 of this report complies with those regulations.

8.1 It is recommended that option 1 be implemented.

**INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT
VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED SCHOOLS**

- 1 The name of the school is Wroot Travis Charity Primary School.
- 2 The school is a voluntary controlled school.
- 3 The name of the governing body is “the governing body of Wroot Travis Charity Primary School”.
- 4 The governing body shall consist of:
 - (a) 2 x parent governors;
 - (b) 1 x authority governor;
 - (c) 1 x elected staff governor;
 - (d) 1 x head teacher
 - (e) 2 x foundation governors (see paragraphs (6) and (7) below);
 - (f) 5 x co-opted governors;
- 5 Total number of governors 12 (except any time when the head teacher has given notice as above that the head teacher chooses not to be a governor, when the total number of governors will be 11)
- 6 The foundation governors shall comprise:-
 - (a) one ex officio foundation governor
 - (b) one foundation governor appointed by the Lincoln Diocesan Board of Education after consultation with Parochial Church Council of the parish in which the school is situated, being people who are fit and willing to support the Anglican ethos, values and aims of the school and be a person of faith

 - (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio:

Principal Officiating Minister (i.e. the incumbent or priest in charge of the parish in which the school is situated or a team vicar with a special cure of souls for the area in which the school is situated)
 - (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which the school is situated after consultation with the Rural Dean of the Deanery in which the school is situated shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor or has been removed from office under regulation 23(2) of the Regulations.

- 8 The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which the school is situated, after consultation with the Rural Dean with oversight for the parish in which the school is situated is entitled to request the removal of any ex-officio foundation governor and appoint a substitute governor.
- 9 Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level. The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.
- 10 This instrument of government comes into effect on 1 September 2014.
- 11 This instrument was made by order of North Lincolnshire Local Education Authority in August 2014.
- 11 A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), and to the appropriate religious body.
