COMMUNITY GRANT FUND APPLICATIONS

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 North Lincolnshire Council has set aside £25,000 to help communities celebrate the Queen's 90th Birthday.
- 1.2 Fourteen requests for support have been received.
- 1.3 To consider these requests for financial assistance.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Queen celebrates her 90th Birthday this year and many communities plan to mark this occasion. The council has indicatively allocated £25,000 to help communities in North Lincolnshire celebrate this event.
- 2.2 The initiatives requesting financial support range from large celebrations, street parties and small community events, to marking the occasion by planting a tree.
- 2.3 Many requests are from town and parish councils, but other community groups and even individuals have asked for support.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 A summary of the applications received is set out in Appendix One.
- 3.2 Option 1 - decide which requests to approve and what level of financial assistance should be provided.

4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

- 4.1 The requests come from a variety of sources to support many types of events and differing levels of support asked for.

4.2 The requests cover large scale events over a number of days, to small street parties. The amount of people covered by each activity also varies. These factors should be taken into account when deciding the amount of financial support to provide.

5. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, STAFFING, PROPERTY, IT)

5.1 Financial

5.1.1 The birthday celebrations grant budget is £25,000. To date, a total of £3,644 has been committed leaving £21,356 available to allocate.

5.1.2 The amount requested in this report is £4,955.
