**DEPARTMENT FOR EDUCATION LOCAL AUTHORITY SECTOR
LED IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME**

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To inform Cabinet Member of the Department for Education Local Authority Sector Led Improvement Programme
- 1.2 For Cabinet Member to support the submission of an application to become a Sector Led Improvement partner to provide a joint package of support across children's social care and Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Department for Education (DfE) published guidance on how to apply to become a Local Authority (LA) Sector Led Improvement (SLI) partner on 16 December 2020.
- 2.2 The SLI programme is designed to help LAs support each other to improve their children's services by working collaboratively, sharing good practice and providing constructive challenge. The programme is designed to encourage collective responsibility for the performance of the sector.
- 2.3 Previous examples of SLI support across children's social care has covered a vast range of practice areas and support has been provided through diagnostic services, case audits, mentoring, training and disseminating learning through conferences and events.
- 2.3 To date, there has not been a SLI approach to SEND and the DfE are also seeking LAs who can also offer SEND improvement support including support for strategic planning and leadership, effective financial management, workforce development, joint working and commissioning, needs assessment and coproduction with parent carers, children and young people.
- 2.4 LAs are invited to submit an application to work with the DfE as a SLI partner to support children's social care improvement, or combined improvement for children's social care and SEND.
- 2.5 As part of the application process, it is necessary to secure evidence of elected members and chief executive support prior to submission. Key milestones are as follows:

- 11 February 2021 - Application to be submitted
- 1 July 2021 to 31 March 2022 – Successful LAs to begin set up/delivery of support

3. **OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION**

3.1 It is proposed that North Lincolnshire submit an application to become a combined SLI partner for both children's social care and SEND.

4. **ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS**

4.1 Those wishing to become a SLI partner must be a high performing LA already delivering excellent services to children and young people, and willing and able to support other LAs to improve their services. North Lincolnshire meets the mandatory requirements to become a SLI partner, as follows:

- We have an outstanding overall Ofsted judgement for children's social care and are at least good across all sub judgements
- We have not yet had a SEND inspection, but we are able to provide strong evidence for the quality of our SEND services and our capacity to provide SEND support to another area

4.2 SLI delivers dual benefits, promoting a culture of improvement for both the recipient and the delivery partner. Retaining the learning and development within the sector that comes from SLI is an important benefit of the programme. This lends itself to North Lincolnshire's growth mindset and learning culture.

5. **FINANCIAL AND OTHER RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (e.g. LEGAL, HR, PROPERTY, IT, COMMUNICATIONS etc.)**

5.1 The anticipated total maximum funding for the period up until March 2022 across the whole scope of the programme is £7.78 million including £280k for SEND SLI support. This may change or be reduced to nil as funding is subject to business planning processes following the spending review settlement. There is no guarantee of funding.

5.2 The minimum support package that can be offered for support across children's social care and SEND is 60 days. This support would be offered from across the Services to Children leadership and management team. Executive level officers would receive a day rate of £800 per person, while management level officers would receive a day rate of £600 per person.

5.3 As part of the application process, there is a requirement to clarify the scope of the offer of support and the anticipated resource allocation across the Services to Children leadership and management team.

5.4 Any funding received would enable the provision of backfill as required and contribute to internal leadership development.
